The First Nation Virtual School and College is collecting personal information about you with this registration form. The information supports a Lifelong Learning Educational Program for you and ensures a safe environment for all students and staff. Some of the ways the school may use the collected information are listed below. The *Information and Privacy Commissioner's Office* states that the school does NOT need written consent from you to:

- Share information with Alberta Education and Advanced Education on registration information, courses and marks upon course completion
- Use a student's name, contact information, and phone number in their absence.
- Use a student's name, photo, or video in the newsletter, yearbook, or within the school community.
- Use a student's name on artwork or material displayed at the school.
- Use the student's name and academic information when the school wishes to apply for provincial or federal awards on behalf of the student.
- Provide student information including photos for identification purposes. Student phone numbers will be provided to bus drivers.

This is not a complete list; it merely gives some examples of how the personal information may be used.

Some of the activities we do at our First Nation Virtual School and College besides providing a solid academic program are "Hard Skills Training" and Soft Skills Training. "Hard Skills Training" is training on Skid Steer, Cats, Backhoes, Carpentry, Plumbing, Landscaping, etc.. "Soft Skills Training" involves all high school and/or Post Secondary course training you need, academic field trips, land-based teachings, First Nation languages that build student attributes, skills, and knowledge. We thank you for your support of our First Nation Virtual School and College and look forward to working with you.

Acceptable Computer Use Agreement

Use of the First Nation College computer network and internet provides great educational benefits to students. Unfortunately, some material accessible via the internet may contain items that are illegal, defamatory, or potentially offensive to some people. Access to the network and Internet is given as a privilege to students who agree to act in a considerate and responsible manner. We require that Students and Parents / Guardians (if student is under the age of 18) read, accept, and sign the following rules for acceptable online behavior.

- 1. Students are responsible for good behavior on the network and Internet just as they are in an First Nation College building. General First Nation College rules for behavior and communications apply.
- 2. Network storage areas may be treated like First Nation College lockers. Network administrators may review files and communications to maintain system integrity and ensure that users are using the system responsibly. **Users should not expect that files will always be private**.
- 3. The following are not permitted.
 - a. Sending or displaying offensive messages or pictures
 - b. Using obscene language at any time while in a College Program or while using Public or Private chat on the virtual classroom learning site
 - c. Harassing, insulting, or attacking others in any means.
 - d. Damaging computers, computer systems or computer networks
 - e. Violating copyright laws
 - f. Using another's password
 - g. Trespassing in another's folders, work, or files
 - h. Intentionally wasting limited resources, including the use of "chain letters" and messages broadcasted to mailing lists or individuals, or using social media and negatively linking it to the First Nation Virtual School and College (ie., Facebook, X, or other)
 - i. Employing the network for commercial purposes (selling proprietary and copyright content of the system on line)
 - j. Revealing the personal address or phone number of yourself or any other person without permission from your Professor or Associate Professor or the First Nation College Student Services Department
 - k. Violations may result in loss of access as well as other disciplinary or legal action.
